

# 2015 FRANKLIN COUNTY Summer YouthWorks Program

The 2015 Franklin County Summer YouthWorks Program will employ approximately 1,605 TANF eligible youth and young adults ages 14-24.

Youth will receive an hourly wage of \$10 and work an average of eight to twelve (8-12) weeks

<b>Program Description:</b>	<p>The 2015 COWIC S.O.A.R Hire! Program will include two internship models:</p> <p><i>Futures Under Construction Model</i> –This model provides opportunity for youth and young adults, with limited to no work experience, to build practical work experiences through structured summer work activities at community entities, local businesses and governmental offices. Under this model youth will also receive workplace competency training and leadership development sessions throughout the 8 week summer program.</p> <p><i>Work-N-Progress Model</i> – This model offers youth, with prior work experience, the opportunity to participate in work based internships in high growth industries. Under this model youth will also receive workplace competency training and leadership development sessions throughout the 8 week summer program.</p> <p>The 2015 COWIC S.O.A.R Hire Program will subcontract with five (5) local service providers; Boys and Girls Club of Central Ohio, Ethiopian Tewahedo Social Services, Henkels &amp; McCoy, MSC –Touch and Wright Choice</p>

<b>Program Description:</b>	<p>The Columbus Urban League's (CUL) Summer Youth Empowerment Program will offer participants placement at work experience sites for up to five days per week. Assignments to worksites will be closely aligned with the skills and interests of each youth as indicated on their individualized career assessments. All youth will participate in 15 hours of work readiness training prior to placement at worksites. Youth will also participate in weekly career development sessions throughout the summer program.</p>

<b>Program Description:</b>	<p>Godman Guild's KEYS program will enroll, train and place youth in internship sites throughout Franklin County with a focus on youth residing in Weinland Park for an 8-12 week period. Godman Guild will leverage other community entities to provide quality work experiences for youth this summer. Godman Guild will subcontract with Central Community House for targeted arts related work experiences; and with the Children's Hunger Alliance to support and expand capacity at several of the Summer Feeding program sites. Many of the youth that apply for the program are either adjudicated youth or teen parents. Additionally, Godman Guild has a formal relationship with the Franklin County Child Support Enforcement Agency for the placement of young adult child support obligors. Youth will participate in a 16-hour of work readiness training.</p>

<b>Program Description:</b>	This program will establish paid work experience opportunities for all youth enrolled. Participants will work with Workforce Development Specialists to assess which work experiences best match their individual vocational skills and interests. Henkels & McCoy will identify worksites that focus on high demand/high growth industries; as well as, employers who are likely to consider older youth for unsubsidized employment at the end of the program. All youth will participate in an 8-hour pre-employment training to prepare them for their work experience.

<b>Program Description:</b>	The Learn to Succeed Project will provide youth with a structured employment opportunity focusing on introducing youth to employers and activities that will positively impact their future careers. All youth enrolled will be assessed for career interests and work experience history, and receive 8 hours of work readiness skills followed by 8 or 12 weeks of actual work experience at identified worksites. SSCH has forged a partnership with PACT (Partners Achieving Community Transformation) and Ohio State University to offer a work-based learning model for students age 14-15. Students will gain age-appropriate work experience which focuses on business management and entrepreneurship. . All youth will participate in an 8-hour pre-employment training to prepare them for their work experience

<b>Program Description:</b>	Student WEB CORPS is an eight week summer work-based learning experience. The experience is designed to strengthen students' web development, project management and professionalism skills. Participants will apply those skills in the authentic task of building a website to champion a local cause relevant to the community. Student-employees will work in groups of five, supported by technology instructors through the summer work experience. TECH CORPS will also work with Lead the Way-Career Pathways to Success Program (a school-year program for junior and seniors interested in pursuing electrical engineering careers) to provide enrolled youth with summer internships within electrical engineering companies. All participants will participate in 8 hours of work readiness training.
