November 28, 2023

Commissioner O'Grady called the meeting to order at 9:12 A.M.

We recognize that our community is in what was the original homeland of the living nations of the Shawnee Tribe, the Delaware Nation, the Delaware Tribe, the Wyandotte Nation, the Mingo Nation, and others, and we extend our gratitude and respect to the many indigenous people who call these lands home. We are committed to celebrating these native communities and to listening to and learning from native voices from across our county each November and throughout the year.

PUBLIC HEARING: Resolving Adverse Effects to the Historic Woodyard East Chapel Funeral Directors building located at 2300 E. Livingston Avenue, Bexley, Ohio 43209, by the Bexley Apartments-Livingston Project Undertaking.

Commissioner O'Grady opened the Public Hearing and asked if anyone would like to speak. Jeanine Hummer, First Assistant Prosecuting Attorney and Chief Counsel, Prosecuting Attorney's Office, explained that this public hearing is required by federal law. She explained that by federal law, the County is the responsible entity for HUD funding for this project. She added that since this project involves a historic structure, there are additional steps that need to be taken, and this public hearing is one of those requirements. She confirmed that the requirement was met, and there would be another

public hearing to allow public comment on this topic. Commissioner O'Grady closed the public hearing, and the resolution was read into the record.

Resolution No. 0920-23, authorizing the County Administrator to enter into a Funding Agreement with the Affordable Housing Trust to create more affordable home ownership and rental housing and to strengthen neighborhoods within Franklin County (\$4,000,000.00) (Economic Development and Planning), presented by Carolyn Thurman, Assistant Director, Economic Development and Planning.

Deputy County Administrator (DCA) Bivens asked for data that shows the reason for targeting Independence High School. She also noted that the County has a global anti-gun violence initiative, and she would like to link Think Make Live Youth into that.

Commissioner Crawley moved to approve Resolution 0924-23, seconded by Commissioner O'Grady. The Resolution was adopted by roll call vote.

Resolution No. 0925-23, approving a subaward agreement with City Year Columbus for youth educational support programming (\$142,324.28) (Job and Family Services), presented by Vivian Turner, Chief Administrator, Job and Family Services.

Resolution No. 0926-23, approving a subaward agreement with The Center for Healthy Families, Inc. for pregnant and parenting teen services (\$250,000.00) (Job and Family Services), presented by Vivian Turner, Chief Administrator, Job and Family Services.

Ms. Turner reviewed information found in documents submitted with the proposed resolution.

Commissioner Crawley asked if there was another resolution that was previously adopted for The Center for Healthy Families for pregnant teens. Ms. Turner stated that the recent resolution for these services was an amendment to last year's agreement. Commissioner Crawley asked when that amendment was passed, to which Ms. Turner replied that she believed it was in mid- to late-September. Zachary Talarek, Director, Office of Management and Budget, noted that the original contract amount last year was

\$250,000.00, and the amendment was for an additional \$33,000.00. Commissioner Crawley asked why Resolution No. 0926-23 was only for \$250,000.00 if last year's contract was for the same amount and required additional funding. Ms. Turner stated that the additional funding last year covered a special program that was offered last year. That program/event is not on the plan to be held this year. Commissioner Crawley asked for a report on how many teens were served. Ms. Turner stated that 95 teens were served in the program last year.

Commissioner Crawley moved to approve Resolution 0926-23, seconded by Commissioner O'Grady. The Resolution was adopted by roll call vote.

Resolution No. 0927-23, approving a subaward agreement with the Educational Service Center of Central Ohio on behalf of the Franklin County Family and Children First Council for Trauma-Informed Care Training (\$675,000.00) (Job and Family Services), presented by Vivian Turner, Chief Administrator, Job and Family Services.

Ms. Turner reviewed information found in documents submitted with the proposed resolution.

Commissioner Crawley moved to approve Resolution 0927-23, seconded by Commissioner O'Grady. The Resolution was adopted by roll call vote.

Resolution No. 0928-23, approving a subaward agreement with Image Character Etiquette, Inc. for boys and girls youth mentoring programming and services (\$488,939.14) (Job and Family Services), presented by Vivian Turner, Chief Administrator, Job and Family Services.

Commissioner Crawley moved to postpone Resolution 0811-23, seconded by Commissioner O'Grady. The Resolution was postponed until General Session on December 12, 2023, by roll call vote.

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The Commissioners and County Administrator congratulated Lauren Rummel, Director, Government Affairs and Ethics, on accepting a new position, and thanked her for her service to the County.
